**Budget Review**

- **CY 2021 budget is still approximately 4% underbudget. We have currently spent approximately 61% of our budget for the first half of 2022. Shelter Care and Safebed is way over budget. We are anticipating another Youth Works stay.**

### **Zone Program Stats**

#### **Vince Gillette – Tribal Liaison**

- **Covid Report as of May 11, 2022: This report has all the reservation, including the SD districts. In ND the active cases: Ft Yates 2, McLaughlin has 1. Total, there have been 27 deaths on the Standing Rock Reservation related to Covid.**
- **There are 51 Active IV E payments for the month of April totaling \$132,102.00. We have 3 subsidized adoption cases and paid \$3,122.00.**
- **Michelle Harrison has been hired as the acting director and is planning to have her staff cover monthly visits of IVE foster care children in their custody beginning May 1. She feels that her workers should know their families and children. Three Rivers HSZ stands by ready to help with visits again if requested.**
- **Interstate Compact on the placement of children (ICPC) has been becoming an issue and Vince has been trying to get clear answers because everyone has a different interpretation of what needs to be completed.**
- **Vince has been working with Joe Ashley, SD DHS, who has similar job duties. Vince is attempting to receive numbers on SD IV-E kids in ND. There are a number of 638 children in ND Foster homes.**
- **Tribal workers have been invited to monthly training sponsored by the DHS.**
- **Last month Vince did 12 FC visits.**
- **The Tribe will receive \$203,909.00 in FMAP reimbursement based on expenses submitted to DHS.**

#### **Brenda Peterson – Income Maintenance Supervisor**

- **Brenda Reported that there is an Eligibility Redesign meeting to be held later today.**
- **Brenda explained the purpose and gave a brief synopsis of the work the Eligibility Department does for our new member Marty Meyer.**
- **See the attached statistical copies for the complete report on Income Maintenance cases and programs.**
- **Total LIHEAP Applications Received in the TRHSZ as of 4/30/22: 837**
  - **Processed LIHEAP Cases: 819**
  - **Pending: 18**
- **SNAP Applications for April 2022 there were 107**
- **Medicaid Applications for April 2022 were at 77**
- **CCAP Cases Applications were at 20**
- **TANF Applications were at 14**
- **Federal Government has extended the pandemic Medicaid through September.**
- **LIHEAP ends on May 31<sup>st</sup>.**
- **We did hire for the 2 vacant positions in the Fort Yates Office. One will be located in Fort Yates and the other will be housed in the Mandan office.**
- **Kim Anderson has accepted the vacated Eligibility Tech position in the Mandan Office, her Office Assistant Position is now open and posted. It is set to expire tomorrow so, we hope to begin interviewing next week.**
- **Dei'Yonna Beck accepted one of the EW positions in Ft Yates, so her position is open. We are making a diligent effort to recruit within the Ft Yates area as the position needs to remain in Ft. Yates. We are going**

to be advertising in the Teton Times, UTTC, Sitting Bull College, KMLD Radio and flyers around the area in hopes of recruiting someone locally. A brief discussion of salaries was held. We have a difficult time competing with the private sector regarding wages.

#### **Jenny Wetsch for Natalie Anderson – Foster Care/In Home/FP Licensing**

- See the attached statistical information which was presented during the meeting.
- Workers are carrying caseloads between 16-19 cases each.
- Currently we have 107 cases of which we have custody of 69 children
- During the last month, we opened 3 cases and closed 10.
- Lexi Eldridge and Danielle Benz have filled the positions vacated by Becka Koll and Rachel Suda.

#### **Jenny Wetsch – Child Protection**

- See the attached Statistical information which was presented during the meeting.
- We received 81 reports in April with 20 of them being Administratively Assessed, 9 Administrative Referrals, and 7 Assessments Terminated in Progress.
- Vicki continues to work as a temp to help until her temp hours expire in June to help with caseloads and visits.
- Dennis shared we plan to make a request to the state for our part time parent aid to become fulltime. The push in the state has been to utilize more parent aids in the homes to keep the families together and the children in the homes.
- Jenny explained the functions of the CPS Unit for our new board member.

#### **2023 Zone Budget Review**

- Dennis and Jodie met with Darcy Roberts of the state for the Budget Review. The budget request for 2023 has been submitted. The Request was made for \$50,000 in safe bed funds and an increase in Safety Perm Funds from \$12,000 to \$18,000.

#### **Zone Budget 2022 Recalculation Review**

- We had our recalculation review with Darcy Roberts on May 10. Overall, it went well.
- Dennis explained the way we do the recalculation. The recalculation requested additional funding if available. At the very least, we hope to receive the current budgeted amount for the second payment.
- Explanation of Indirect Costs was given by Dennis to the board.

#### **CHINS Unit**

- On August 1, CHINS cases that normally would have been referred to Juvenile Court will now be referred to a unit. This unit will also take the responsibility of dual status cases.
- DHS is considering 8 staff and 1 supervisor for this new unit. The Zone Directors voted 13 to 6 to have this unit be zone employees and not state employees. The supervisor will do most of the supervision via telecommute. The remaining 8 staff will be divided up throughout the State/Zones.
- Approximately 80% of the referrals to this unit will be informational without a lot of additional involvement.

#### **Other**

- Discussion was held over the issues of failed placements and how it affects kids. Excessive Maintenance Payments (EMP) have been offered but we are still struggling to get the EMP's approved to Foster Care Families.
- There is a need for more preventative resources. Discussion commenced regarding this topic.
