Budget Review

- So far CY 2022 we are staying within budget. January through June we had spent 46% of our overall budget, leaving us under by 4% for the year.
- Dennis reported, the TRHSZ has ordered 21 computers with software installation. These computers were ordered through NRG who will also setup and install software.

Zone Program Stats

Vince - Three Rivers Human Service Zone Tribal Liaison Report for July 2022

- Standing Rock Covid numbers as of June 14. There are 19 active cases on Standing Rock, with 17 of those cases in Ft Yates and 2 in Porcupine. 27 deaths since COVID started.
- There are 75 Active IV-E children.
- Raquel Thompson was hired as the new Director of CPS. She had been the director about 5 years ago.
- One of Raquel's first orders of business was to have her workers to do most monthly visits of children placed in foster. She believes her workers need to be seeing their kids in face-to-face visits and does not believe she needs our assistance currently. Since this was announced earlier this week, we are trying to come up with a plan going forward. Vince feels he can still assist with the IV-E foster care determinations and payments, foster care Medicaid issues, payment issues, Foster Parent concerns and other things that come up.
- Vince had TEAMS meetings this month, one with Zones of children placed in ND foster homes. Present at the meeting was the tribal director, case managers and zone case managers. They talked about payment issues, placement issues, ICPC and any other pertinent issues that come up. The tribal director and case managers meet with the new licensing unit. The Unit started in April to go over how things were done, as far as the tribe accessing foster homes is a different process.
- There is a standing monthly meeting with the IV-E foster state unit and tribal workers about cases i.e. what is needed in cases, court expirations, any changes to report, etc.
- John Pretty Bear is planning to attend the HEW meeting to represent the tribe on the canceling of the MOU. He recommended that Vince and Dennis attend once the meeting is scheduled. He will obtain the agenda from Ann Bobtail Bear and send an invite to Dennis and Vince.
- Dennis and Vince are discussing what changes in his job duties need to occur not that he's not making or scheduling visit for tribal foster children. One thought was to reach out to other tribes in ND to see if he can assist with attaining the FMAP and TCM responsibilities for reimbursement which would help sustain positions within the tribes.

Brenda Peterson – Income Maintenance/Eligibility Supervisor

- See the attached statistical copies for the complete report on Income Maintenance cases and programs.
 - Pandemic has extended through September for Medicaid and probably longer. The number of cases for Medicaid has been decreasing due to the closing of LIHEAP for the year.
 - The number of Reviews due have been increasing as well as Application totals have seen an increase.
 - LIHEAP ended on May 31.
 - Child Care apps have increased
 - SNAP Issuance still high on the caseload. They are including the Pandemic EBT for children in school.
 - Food Pantries are facing limited resources due to the economy

- TANF we have closed a lot of cases since the work requirement went into effect. They are still looking at making changes to the requirements. There are meetings in August of which Brenda McAllister will be attending.
- The Eligibility unit is now full staffed with all vacancies filled.
- There will be changes implemented to the scanned documents, so the documents only need to be touched once.
- The client kiosks have arrived at all 3 offices as of yesterday. We now need to determine the proper location and to arrange for their installation. We need to know if we have wireless capability with this. The kiosks are funded by the state.

Jenny Wetsch – Child Protection

Natalie Anderson – Foster Care/In Home/FP Licensing

- See the attached statistical information which was presented during the meeting.
- Currently we have 99 cases.
 - 67 Foster Care
 - 32 In-Home Cases, ICPC, Courtesy Case Management & Home Study's
- Vicki Zimmerman's hours for the temporary assistance ended at the end of June. We are managing the current caseload so no need to renew the temp position currently. This can be requested if needed in the future.

TRHSZ 2022 Direct and Indirect Payment

- Our second payment for the year for direct costs is \$2,002,000.
- Our second payment for the year for indirect costs is \$170,000.
- The Auditor's Office manages the Indirect funding, it goes into the general fund. The Auditor will divide the indirect funds between the three counties of the zone.
- Carson will be spending a portion of their indirect funds to place a drop box at that office due to the election drop box being shut down.

TRHSZ 2023 Budget

- Dennis and Jodie worked with Donna Aukland on the 2023 Budget in June. The TRHSZ will be receiving \$3,985,000 for fiscal year 2023.
- Dennis has been working with other zones with the development of a universal foster care/in-home checklist. Hopefully, this checklist will help workers become more efficient and utilize best practice concepts for the delivery of services.

Other:

- Interviews were held for the replacement of Brenda Peterson. An offer has not been made at this time.
- Theresa Gruenberg has been hired for the Office Assistant position and will be starting August 1.
- Discussed the Grant County Commission meeting that Dennis attended. The Dropbox for Grant County was discussed, he had gone over the placement of troubled children, recent disbursements and the 2023 Budget.



Covid report. 19 cases on Standing Rock, all in ND. 17 cases in Ft Yates and 2 cases in Porcupine. 27 deaths since Covid started.

Standing Rock CPS has hired a new Director, Raquel Thompson, she was the Director of CPS, about 5 years ago. One of her first order of business was to end the MOU with DHS. She believes her workers need to be seeing their kids in face to face visits and does not believe she needs our assistance. We have been visiting or arranging for about 75 visits with IV E foster kids a month. This just happened earlier this week, so we having been trying to come up with a strategy on how to proceed. I still assist with IV E foster care determinations and payments, foster care Medicaid issues, payment issues, Foster parents concerns and other things that come up.

I've had 3 Teams meeting this month, one with Zones that have tribal placements, SD DHS IVE, they have about 35 placements in ND, The tribal director and case managers and Zone case managers. We talk about payment issues, placement issues, ICPC and any other pertinent issues that come up. The tribal director and case managers meet with the new Licensing Unit. Licensing unit is new, started in April and how things were done, as far as tribe accessing foster homes is a different process now and the unit covered this. We have a standing monthly meeting with the IV E foster state unit and tribal workers about cases i.e. whats need in cases, court expirations, changes to report etc.

Dennis and are discussing what my job duties will be because of the changes with CPS.
