**Budget Review**

- So far CY 2023 we are currently under budget.

- Dennis Meier and Jodie Leier worked with Jason Coffey on the 2023 Budget Recalc. The recalculation will decrease the second 2023 payment by over \$100,000. If we do go over the new budgeted amount, we could tap into our reserve funding.

### Zone Program Stats

Three Rivers Human Service Zone Tribal Liaison Report for May 2023, presented by Vince Gillette.

- Standing Rock Covid numbers as of May 4, 2023. There are 7 active cases on Standing Rock, Morton has 5, Grant has 0 and Burleigh has 36 according to the ND Dept of Health. There are 182 new cases statewide. At this time last year there were 316 active cases statewide. The Covid Pandemic ended effective the close of business, May 11, 2023 by the US Dept of Health and Human Services.
- There are 55 ND Active IV-E Tribal children and 180+ Tribal 638 foster care placements.
- DHS has not sent out any current dollar amounts spent on SRST IV-E since November 2022.
- Vince continues to attend the monthly TEAMS meeting with the ND CFS, SD CFS, Tribe, and Zone Staff throughout the state who have tribal foster care placements in their foster homes. There is a separate meeting for Licensure of Foster Homes, Tribal Foster Children placed in Zone Foster Homes, a case management monthly training and a State and Tribal IV E eligibility meeting. Vince helps to facilitate visits for 75 children between Zones and foster facilities. He also answers questions for the foster parents about various topics.
- Vince sits on the planning committee for the yearly ICWA Conference. This year is planned as Face to Face and is being held in the Turtle Mountains in the summer of 2023.
- Vince has been meeting with Dean Sturn, DHS, the State, Federal and Casey Program that provide technical assistance to the tribes. From this meeting TRHSZ has agreed to provide technical assistance to the Native American Training Institute to help train their IV-E Specialist.
- Vince did onsite technical assistance for Spirit Lake Social Services on Monday, February 6 and for Turtle Mountain on Tuesday, February 7. Two Native American Training Institute staff were at the presentations. Both TMSS and SLTSS requested the onsite training for the IV-E program. They are working on additional dates to have more training.
- Vince has assisted Standing Rock, Spirit Lake, and Turtle Mountain help with their FMAP reimbursement capturing a grand total of \$1,037,778.00 for the 2021-23 Biennium. MHA will lose \$277,225.00 to ND's General Fund if they do not complete the requested paperwork by June 30, 2023.
- Tribes also can claim IV-E Admin expenses as far back as 7 quarters.
- Vince has been assisting Burleigh County with transportation for Foster Care due to their staff shortage. He has done 18 assists in the last month.

Mandy Garrett – Income Maintenance/Eligibility Supervisor

- See the attached complete report on Income Maintenance cases and programs.
  - There is currently no backlog for our region, Region 3. Includes Dakota Central, TRHSZ, Roughrider, Burleigh, and Southwest.
  - The state started redistributing backlog cases from Region 4 (Cass County) on 5/8/23 to all regions across the state
    - Workers did see a significant increase in work with applications dated back to March 2023 from Region 4.
  - LIHEAP is nearing the end of the season on 5/31/23.

- Medicaid has started the PHE unwind process; June will be the first month we can start closing cases when the program requirements are not met.
- SNAP is seeing a large number of expedited applications and not enough workers to process cases in Group 2.
  - Looking at possibly moving a group 3 worker into group 2 to assist.
  - Roughrider has 5 open positions and 2 of these are in the SNAP processors in Group 2.
- TANF program is also assisting Region 4 (Cass) for the last several months and has seen an increase in work due to program changes.
- Childcare Assistance program has not seen any changes.
- Call Center has Supervisors and a Team Lead training the Tier 1 staff (temporary call center staff).
- At the State Supervisor's meeting on 5/10/23 the Call Center reported that they had 820 calls received that day and only missed 20 calls with the longest wait time being 33 seconds.
- Three Rivers staff do on occasion sit with without work so they are assisting the call center with emails from the Central email box.
- The SNAP program held a meeting last week to discuss bringing the issuance of EBT cards back to our office. They will think about this. This is an issue that needs to have a legislator use their connections to move this process to the front.

**Jenny Wetsch – Child Protection**

- See the attached Statistical information which was presented during the meeting.
  - 86 total reports in April. 2 Reports in Grant County. 0 Reports in Sioux County
    - 51 assigned as Full Assessments
    - 2 ATP Assessments
    - 33 Administratively Assessed or Administrative Referrals
    - 1 Alt Response
    - 2 Child Sex Cases
    - 0 Prenatal Drug Cases
    - Total number of courtesy interview requests-0 from other zones and 1 LE assist
    - 0 Conflict case for another zone
- Parent Aid caseloads increased by 2. They are also helping with Burleigh County child transports.

**Natalie Anderson – Foster Care/In Home/FP Licensing**

- See the attached statistical information which was presented during the meeting.
- Currently we have 74 cases.
  - 52 Foster Care (33 Foster homes/PATH, 2 QRTP/PRTF, 15 Relative Care, 2 in the 18+)
  - 23 In-Home Cases, ICPC, Courtesy Case Management & Home Study's
- Cases have gone down by 32. This is in part due to many sibling groups being adopted and kids returning home.
- Sara Moran started on March 27 but has decided to return to her former employer and Lexi Eldridge has accepted a position at Burleigh County. These jobs have been posted. It would be nice if the Zones had an exit interview process. Dennis explained the way we are going to request filling these positions as 60/40 positions. Meaning, that 60% of their time will be Foster Care and 40% of their time will be CPS due to the shift in Cases due to the Safety Framework Process Model. We are seeing increased CPS cases with decreased Foster Care/In Home cases.
- Our workers have been helping Burleigh with transports and helping our CPS unit when needed.

- We have hired our first paid internship. Kylie Dosch is doing her field placement for 5 weeks. She began on Monday, May 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### Legislative Bills:

- SB 2012 DHS and Zone Budget approval with 200 million for zones. The next biennium provides a 6% and 4% salary increase. We can use the previous evals from earlier this year for July's increase unless there have been significant changes in an employee's performance. If there has been changes in performance then a new evaluation will need to be done. Kristen Hasbargen and Aaron Burst will be sending a letter regarding the wage increases to the Auditors and Commissioners explaining the fiscal year changes from January 1 to July 1.
- SB 2139 Pertained to the Indigent Burial. The statewide average for approved burials is 300 a year. A proposal was made for \$3500 for cremation and \$8500 for regular burials. The legislature passed a blanket \$3500 max for all burials.
- HB 1091 Certified Foster Home and Kinship Provider Bill. Certified homes don't have the same requirements as licensed Foster Care Homes. Under this program, the providers can be friends, neighbors or a relative if there is a connection to the child.
- HB 1046 Covers the Zone Indirect and Direct Costs. This pertains to sorting out the indirect costs and sending them to the correct cost pool. A letter will be sent from Kristen Hasbargen in July reminding county auditors of the information they need to provide to Abacus on or before 9/15/2023. If the information is not received by Abacus by 9/15/2023 the county runs the risk of not receiving reimbursement for indirect costs.
- HB 1040 – PERS program is changing from a Defined Benefit program to a Defined Contribution. This change is supposed to take affect January 1, 2024 for all new employees.

#### Directors Meeting Overview:

- 3.75 million had been recommended for Zone Equity. The plan is for the state to start with the Zones that have the biggest gap for the same job equity. Benefits are not approved but the goal is to make them more equitable.
- Sons of Liberty is an Ultra Conservative Group who are morally and fiscally conservative. Jackie interjected to provide a bit more information on the group. They are Caucus Groups that elect officers in their districts. The districts that are currently involved are 9, 16, 29, 30 and 33.
- Zones are required to have a local legislator on their boards on or before 1/1/2024. A brief discussion among the board members was held as there were suggestions of who may be the most appropriate to solicit for this position at TRHSZ.
- This biennium 90 million has been allocated to Childcare. 15 million to Infant and Toddler Daycare Providers. 20 million will be allocated to increase the utilization of childcare. There will be money available for childcare training and money for seasoned providers to mentor other providers. There will be numerous grants for start-ups and education and management.
  - Should TRHSZ (or other zones) be offering the childcare/employer benefit match for employees geared towards childcare? Dennis should have more information at a future meeting.
- Updates will need to be done for the indigent burial policy.
- Salary increases will be effective July 1<sup>st</sup>, with more guidance coming from OMB.
- The Fiscal year proposal is set to begin July 1. This does not require approval of the Zone board. This change will be presented to the host county commission.
- Cost Allocation plan requirements will be sent out soon.

- **Corey Pederson informed the directors that 22% of Zone custody children have been in custody 2 or more years.**
- **There is a meeting tomorrow for all Eligibility Workers in the customer support unit. There are issues that have arisen regarding adjusted schedules and other items.**
- **Adoption and Foster Care Redesign is to begin in the near future. In August the adoption redesign begins and foster care in the first quarter of 2024.**
- **There was an increase of 39% for shelter care costs from \$395 to \$555 daily rate. We are hoping that this will bring Youthworks in Bismarck back to the table.**

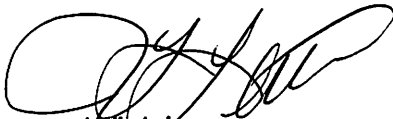
- **The finalizing of our Zone policy manual is coming out by the end of June.**

- **Next week we have our first meeting regarding the 2024 budget. Dennis and Jodie will be meeting to do the prep work for this on Monday.**
- **Natalie and Supervisors across the state are looking at the classifications of why some of the supervisors are HSPA III's vs HSPA IV's when they are doing the same work. This was also brought up at the Director's meeting. Dennis is looking into a reclassification for Jenny and Natalie.**

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The Covid report as of May 4, 2023, is Sioux County has 1 active cases. Morton has 5, Grant has 0 and Burleigh has 36, according to the ND dept of Health website. There are 182 new cases, statewide, for the week of 05-04-23. There were 316 active cases at this time last year. The Covid 19 Pandemic has ended effective close of business, May 11, 2023 by the US Dept of Health and Human Services.

There are approx. 120ish SRST foster children placed in ND foster homes that I help facilitate visits . 38 of these placements are SD IV E foster cases, 55 ND Tribal IV E cases and 180+ tribal 638 foster care placements. It's hard to get a firm number because Zones do not license Foster Homes anymore, so Zone workers don't know who is in their foster homes. These numbers do not show up in ND statistics, because we are only concerned with the foster children where a ND agency is the legal custodian. DHS has not sent out any current dollar amounts spent on SRST Tribal IV E children since Nov, 2022. Standing Rock currently has 55 ND IV E cases and 38 SD IV E case placed in ND foster homes.

I continue to attend monthly TEAMS meeting with the ND CFS, SD CFS, Tribal and Zone Staff throughout the state, who have tribal foster care placement in their foster homes. There are separate meetings for Licensure of foster homes, Tribal foster children placed in Zone Foster homes, A case management monthly training and a state IV E and Tribal IV E eligibility meeting. I help facilitate visits for approx. 100+ children between zones SW and Zone foster homes and group facilities. Answer questions for foster parents about various topics. I spend a lot of time with Medicaid issues with the foster kids Medicaid, bills not being paid, getting SD foster kids on ND Medicaid and talking with business offices of medical facilities clearing up nonpayment issues. I have recently starting dealing with FC Medicaid payment issues for the whole human service zone. I also sit on the planning committee for the ICWA conference, this involves TEAMS meeting setting up the

conference, speakers etc. The conference is being held in the Turtle Mountains this year and is being planned as an in-person conference, summer, 2023.

I'm in the process of setting up IV E Admin reimbursement training for Turtle Mountain and Spirit Lake, so they can start accessing IV E admin Reimbursement. This is an uncapped reimbursement based on eligible IV E Admin expenses.

Both TMSS and SLTSS requested onsite training on IV E reimbursement. They are both looking at filing for IV E reimbursement, which would be an additional money on top of the FMAP. We are trying to get some dates. I am also assisting the Admin Person at Spirit Lake. She is young with no experience and the director is an interim director and doesn't have experience completing forms for the BIA and I have assisted her getting instructions on how to complete forms and where to send them.

I sent an email offering to help MHA nation with their FMAP reimbursement. They have not submitted for this biennium and apparently must submit paperwork for last Biennium because of some problem. The director is currently on Maternity leave.

I have assisted the following Reservations receive FMAP funding. Standing Rock CPS; \$206,909, Spirit Lake Child Welfare \$312, 849; Turtle Mountain Child Welfare; \$518,020, for a grand total of \$1,037,778.00 for the 21-23 Biennium. MHA has \$277,225.00 that goes back in the North Dakota's general fund if MHA doesn't complete the reimbursement request by June 30, 2023. ND will release the new FMAP amounts that Tribes can claim for expenses during the 23-25 biennium.

Tribes also can claim IV E admin expenses, but they must submit timely reimbursement requests. They can claim back 7 quarters from the present quarter. I have been talking with them to apply for past year. they have lost 4 quarters or a years' worth of admin expenses because they didn't submit the claims. IV E Admin reimburses about 25% of total admin costs. This would have been an additional \$328,750.00 the tribes lost because they didn't complete the reimbursement requests. I have offered to complete

the paperwork for them, if they would just get me the expenses, but no one has taken me up on my offer. Actually, Standing Rock took me up on my offer in 2019 and first quarter in 2020. They had a different director, and I was able to get Standing Rock \$80,912 in reimbursement for 4 quarters, so it can add up to some real money.

### Three Rivers Zone office information:

- We are currently hiring for an Eligibility worker to replace Mylinda Schultz
- Some staff have started working flexible schedules and are very happy with the change!
- We meet monthly as a zone to go over office procedures/policy.
  - Staff really enjoy getting to see familiar friendly faces!

### Region 3 Information:

- Currently have no backlog
- State started distributing backlog of cases from Region 4 on 5/8/2023 to all Regions across the state
  - Workers did see a significant increase in work with applications dated back into March 2023 from Region 4
- LIHEAP (Fuel Assistance) program is not seeing a lot of applications due to end of season approaching on 5/31/2023
- Medicaid program has started PHE unwind process, June will be the first month we can start closing cases when program requirements are not met
- SNAP program has is seeing a large amount of expedited applications and not enough workers to process cases in group 2
  - Currently working with Regional Manager to hopefully move a group 3 (Medicaid/SNAP/Child Care/ TANF Swimlane) worker into our group to assist
  - Roughrider has 5 open positions and 2 of these positions are SNAP application processors in group 2 (Medicaid/SNAP swim lane)
- TANF (Temporary assistance for Needy Families) program has been assisting Region 4 for several months and has seen an increase in work due to program changes
- Childcare assistance program has no changes

### Call Center information (statewide):

- Supervisors and team lead are currently training Tier 1 staff (temporary call center staff)
- During state supervisor meeting on 5/10/2023- Call Center reported they had 820 calls received that day and missed 20 calls with the longest wait time was 33 seconds

### Support Specialist (statewide):

- Three Rivers staff do sit with no work and are assisting call center with e-mails from central e-mail inbox
